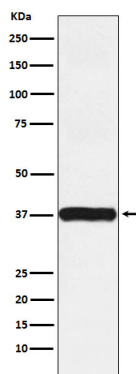

Function	ATP-binding component of the Arp2/3 complex, a multiprotein complex that mediates actin polymerization upon stimulation by nucleation-promoting

factor (NPF) (PubMed:[9000076](#)). The Arp2/3 complex mediates the formation of branched actin networks in the cytoplasm, providing the force for cell motility (PubMed:[9000076](#)). Seems to contact the pointed end of the daughter actin filament (PubMed:[9000076](#)). In podocytes, required for the formation of lamellipodia downstream of AVIL and PLCE1 regulation (PubMed:[29058690](#)). In addition to its role in the cytoplasmic cytoskeleton, the Arp2/3 complex also promotes actin polymerization in the nucleus, thereby regulating gene transcription and repair of damaged DNA (PubMed:[17220302](#), PubMed:[29925947](#)). The Arp2/3 complex promotes homologous recombination (HR) repair in response to DNA damage by promoting nuclear actin polymerization, leading to drive motility of double-strand breaks (DSBs) (PubMed:[29925947](#)).
