**Application Note** This product has been assayed against 1.0 ug of Sheep IgG in a standard

capture ELISA using pNPP p-nitrophenyl phosphate code # NPP-10 as a substrate for 30 minutes at room temperature. A working dilution of 1:1,300 to 1:5,400 of the reconstitution concentration is suggested for this product.

**Purity** This product was prepared from monospecific antiserum by immunoaffinity

chromatography using Sheep IgG coupled to agarose beads followed by solid

phase adsorption(s) to remove any unwanted reactivities. Assay by

immunoelectrophoresis resulted in a single precipitin arc against anti-Alkaline Phosphatase (calf intestine), anti-Rabbit Serum, Sheep IgG, Sheep IgG F(c) and

Sheep Serum. No reaction was observed against Sheep IgG F(ab')2.

**Storage Condition** Store vial at 4° C before opening. DO NOT FREEZE. This product is stable at

4° C as an undiluted liquid. Dilute only prior to immediate use. Freezing alkaline phosphatase conjugates will result in a substantial loss of enzymatic

activity.
